## Why train as a driving instructor?

One of the best aspects of life as a driving instructor is its flexibility. It's so easy to organise your work around other aspects of your life, such as your children, which makes it the perfect career for anyone keen to offer a service that makes a genuine difference to people's lives, yet remain in control of their working hours. At 4 Wheelz, our instructors are free to work on either a full-time or part-time basis, taking on as many students as they feel comfortable with, so whether you want to work seven days a week or three, it's no problem – all we ask is that you give your students your very best during those hours.

## **Earning Potential**

If you work 20 one hour lessons per week, your gross takings would be £460 approx and after expenses such as car lease, fuel, insurance and franchise which are all tax-deductible your net takings would be over £270 per week (£13,000+ per annum).

If you work 35 one hour lessons per week, your gross takings would be £820 approx and after expenses such as car lease, fuel, insurance and franchise which are all tax-deductible your net takings would be over £600 per week (£29,000+ per annum).

The RAC in its published report on Motoring claims that it costs "an average of £6,689" per annum or £557 per month to own and run a car in Britain.

If you run an average family car, you will be saving between £50 to a £128 per week by selling it and using your lease car for tuition and personal use. The amount you could save is dependent on the model of car and whether it's on finance. Most driving instructor car leases include car servicing, tyres and road tax.

## The first step

Should you decide to begin training as a driving instructor, the first step is to get a full Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) formerly known as a CRB check. To start this process, you need to be over 21 years of age and should have held your driving licence for at least three years, with no more than four penalty points.

To get started, we will put you in touch with the DBS, who will be responsible for the whole process. You can do this online and go through a series of questions, covering things like how long you've had your licence, whether you have any points on it, your name and address etc.

The whole process takes 2-8 weeks depending on your individual circumstances, such as past criminal convictions and changes of address. For example, I've met one person whose DBS check took just a fortnight, whereas another person's took over two months.

Once your DBS check has been approved, you will receive a certificate in the mail, which the Driver & Standards Agency will also receive a copy of, allowing us to move forward with your training. At this point, you will be expected to register with the Driver & Vehicle Standards Agency, although the good news is that this process generally doesn't take as long and can be done entirely online (typically around ten days).

In practice, we have no problem beginning your training while you're still waiting for your DBS check and getting registered with the Driver & Vehicle Standards Agency so that you're not forced to wait for weeks before getting started. Once we've received confirmation that you're registered with the DVSA, you will be able to apply for the first exam.

While you're waiting for your DBS check, you can start studying for your theory. We will provide the necessary training materials for you to study at home and arrange classroom training sessions with a DVSA ORDIT registered trainer. Don't worry if you're not sure where to start with this — when you receive your material, we will go through it with you to ensure you're completely clear how to approach it and develop effective study habits. With this level of support, we find that the vast majority of clients progress very quickly, regardless of what position they started in.

## The three exams you'll need to pass

To become an Approved Driving Instructor, there are three exams you must pass:

- 1. Theory plus Hazard Perception
- 2. Driving Ability
- Ability to Coach (instructional ability )

## Theory plus Hazard Perception

As you will have received the study materials early on and will get lots of help in the classroom, including a mock test, there's no need to feel anxious about this first exam.

Indeed, we won't put you forward for the exam until we are completely confident that you have achieved a sufficiently high standard to pass on the first attempt.

## **Driving Ability**

You'll be familiar with the basic format of this exam from your own driving test, but it is far more comprehensive. You'll be tested in a greater variety of settings, such as country lanes, motorways, towns, etc. You'll also be tested on a variety of reverse manoeuvres, along with the emergency stop. It's extremely intensive, but we will make sure your driving skills are of a high enough standard to handle virtually any situation you may find yourself in and that you'll be able to teach with authority.

## Ability to Coach (Instructional Ability)

This exam is the part that will be new to most people and is perhaps the most important part of the whole process. No matter how good a driver you are, it's unlikely you'll ever have had to teach those same skills to someone else. You may not even have ever been in the position of a teacher before.

That's why you'll receive a minimum of 40 hours training for this exam, ten of which will take place in the classroom, while the rest will take place in the car. This involves a lot of roleplay during training. The trainers will ensure that the training is always delivered in a relaxed and comfortable manner. The subsequent exam will involve coaching a pupil while a DVSA examiner assesses the quality of your teaching skills. During your classroom training, we will use a selection of videos to ensure you are familiar with the format of these lessons and the sort of tests you should expect.

There are two options: take the Ability to Instruct Part Three exam after your training, or take the option of a trainee Licence.

Taking the Trainee Licence before you take the final exam will allow you to gain invaluable hands-on experience with real learner drivers. This is one of the very best ways to develop as an instructor, as you'll be able to hone your skills and apply what you've learnt in a real-world environment, so you'll know exactly what to expect come the day of the exam. In practice, it takes a minimum of 18 weeks for most people to reach the point where they get their trainee licence and can start taking on students. The beauty of this is that you can maintain an income while studying for your qualification, something that's not possible in many other professions. This licence is valid for six months, during this time you'll be able to take your final exam to become an ADI.

How soon can you begin as a qualified driving instructor?

Once you've received confirmation that you've passed the third exam, you are officially a DVSA-approved driving instructor (although studying with us, you will have already been teaching students well before then!).

Here are the pass rates for each of these three exams, for both 4 Wheelz and the national average as quoted by the DVSA:

|                              | National Average | 4 Wheelz |
|------------------------------|------------------|----------|
| Theory and Hazard Perception | 51%              | 98%      |
| <b>Driving Ability</b>       | 53%              | 94.4%    |
| Coaching Ability             | 31%              | 88.8%    |

As you can see from the above statistics, all the extra classroom training and support from veteran trainers that we offer during your training is more than worth it in the long run. More than anything else, we focus on treating you as an individual, not a number. Everyone learns differently, so it's important that your training as a driving instructor takes this into account and remains flexible enough to get you the result you're capable of in each exam.

The classroom training provided (something that few training companies offer) for each exam is extremely important in this regard, as it ensures continuity in your learning and that you're actually absorbing the information in the right way. It certainly takes more effort on our part, but the results are more than worth it, which is why we encourage all the instructors we train to adopt the same approach when they take on their own students.

In fact, many of our students are happy to pay upfront for their lessons, which is wonderful from your point of view as it eliminates the familiar driving instructor's problem of students scheduling lessons then not bothering to show up. If they've paid upfront, they'll have a strong incentive to arrive on time and make the most of the lesson, while you'll have been paid upfront either way. As a result of this, absenteeism is rarely a problem for our instructors. We even provide every student with an appointment and progress report booklet, so you don't even need to worry about that.

As an instructor, you will choose local postcodes to your home within which you'll teach, which means that you'll have a steady flow of students within your local area that's convenient for you. And that means no long, costly drives to lessons. If you do want to do more to promote yourself locally, we will supply you with quality business cards that you can hand out, as well as professionally printed flyers if you want them, although, in practice, we've found that this is not usually necessary, given the high number of students our instructors acquire through our online marketing.

Unlike many other driving schools, we will not charge you a penny for your franchise until you have acquired a base number of students that we will agree with you in advance. The purpose of this is to ensure that your new business sets off on a firm financial footing as early as possible. After all, it's in our best interests to have you be as successful as possible! You'll receive whatever support you need in order to acquire your first students. Although many driving schools start charging franchise fees straight away, regardless of whether the instructor is actually getting any work, the steady flow of new students we can provide means that there's no need for us to do this, allowing us to enjoy a much stronger working relationship with all our instructors. Furthermore, we won't ever charge you for the students we refer to you.

To ensure that you can maintain a steady income even if your own car is off the road, we will supply you with a spare dual control car. Or, if you are leasing a car from one of the many leasing companies, they would provide another dual control car within 48 hours, so there'll be very few lessons to cancel or reschedule.

## What if you struggle in your new role as an instructor?

If you do find yourself struggling in your new role for any reason, don't worry — we will do everything in our power to get you back on track and make sure your experience of life as a driving instructor is a great one. Whatever the reasons for you struggling, once you let us know you need a little extra support, we will schedule time with one of our trainers for you, so we can get to the root of the problem and take measures to remedy it. Our trainers are all veteran driving instructors themselves and so have seen first-hand the various challenges faced by newly qualified instructors. Although they will not hesitate to point out any areas of your teaching in which you need to improve, they will remain patient and objective at all times.

## Standards Check

Every 1-4 years depending on your grade you will need to pass a compulsory Standards Check test, which involves a DVSA examiner sitting in the back of the car during one of your driving lessons and rating the quality of your teaching. The Standards Check assesses three main areas, lesson planning, management of risk, your teaching and coaching strategies. 13% of ADIs fail their Standards Check. The great majority of driving instructors that have trained with 4Wheelz call and book Standards Check training when they receive notification from the DVSA and we have a 100% success rate. If you have trained with us, we discount your Standards Check training.
